

# Telemetry subsidy information

## What you need to know



### Policy

Queensland's non-urban water measurement policy states the government's intent to require telemetry on surface water meters in the Queensland Murray-Darling Basin.



### Subsidised telemetry devices

The funding will cover the upfront cost of the telemetry device, installation and the first year of data services.\*



### Manual meter reads

Meter read submissions will continue as normal (meter read online, email or post).



### Meter requirements

Meters must be compliant and meet the Queensland interim water meter standard for non-urban metering.



### Telemetry device installation

The department has engaged Goanna Ag to assist in the delivery of the subsidised devices. They will work directly with you to arrange installation.



### Telemetry data validation

Telemetry data will be used to support the department's water management and regulatory responsibilities.

## What you need to do

### 1. Eligible locations

- › Lower Balonne Water Management Area (WMA)
- › Moonie River Catchment
- › Stanthorpe WMA
- › Upper Condamine WMA
- › Condamine Balonne Tributaries WMA
- › Condamine Balonne WMA

### 2. Device installation
